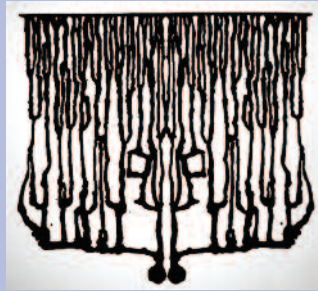

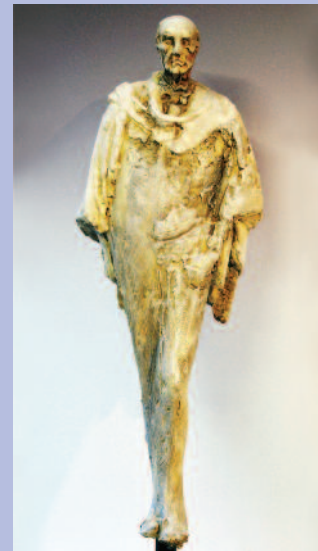

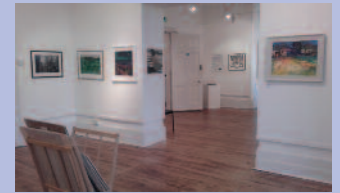

EVENTS

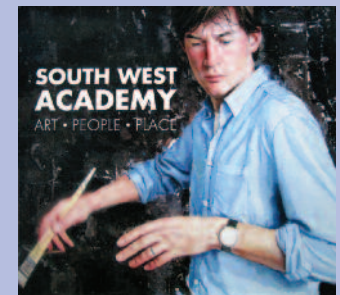
